

Graduate Medical Education Research Guidelines

Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education accredited residency /fellowship programs require scholarly activity. This activity is usually integrated into the training program and does not require specifically dedicated additional time or resources.

If the usual residency/fellowship training program is interrupted for a defined time that is dedicated solely to research without any concurrent patient care activity, then:

- A) Funding from sources other than Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH) will support the research activity. The appropriate time away from clinical training and salary support must be negotiated between institutions/departments by the program director prior to acceptance of a trainee into this specific research activity..
- B) Upon the trainee's return to an ACGME accredited year, the resident/fellow should be paid by JMH at a level commensurate with the ACGME training
- C) All trainees who participate in research with human subjects and medical records of human subjects must be in compliance with all research related policies, including:
 - a) Completion of Collaborative IRB Training Initiative (CITI)
 - b) Submission and approval of protocol by the Institutional Review Board by the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine
 - c) Approval by Jackson CIO. Additional costs incurred for this research, conducted under the auspices of a faculty member, should be borne by the appropriate faculty/department.
 - d) Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA)
